We are pleased that you are interested in our daycare center! For a quick overview, we have summarized the most important information here.

Who we are

Founded in 1993 by parents from Munich, Planegg, and the Max Planck Institute of Biochemistry, the daycare center is run by a nonprofit organization and is organized in the form of a **parent initiative**. As the funding body, the Würmtal communities and the city of Munich could be won.

In addition, the Max Planck Institutes of Biochemistry and of Neurobiology support us financially and idealistically.

Location, size and facilities

The daycare center is located on the **green outskirts** of Martinsried in a quiet location between fields and forest and is easily accessible by car and public transport (U3, U6 + bus 266, 267).

In the lovingly furnished rooms of a Max Planck apartment, **3 to 4 child minders** take care of a group of **11 children** aged **1 to 3.5 years**. The facility includes a **large garden** with lots of play equipment and direct access to the group room.

Food

The food for the children is every day freshly provided from a catering service in **organic quality**. In between there are snack breaks with fresh fruits and vegetables.

What does parent initiative mean?

The entire establishment is organized by the parents in cooperation with the head of the child care workers. This means active involvement and also more participation and closeness to everyday life of your child. It also saves administrative costs.

The responsibilities are distributed clear, fair and according to knowledge / preferences.

Our motto is: smiling children in good hands. In a family atmosphere, the children learn with lots of fun and games and thus have the opportunity to develop in a safe environment.

- we give the children **clear boundaries** as the basis of social learning,
- we bring them closer to **dealing with nature** and the environment.
